Explain the relationship between the structures and properties of THREE different polymers from ethylene and glucose, and their uses.

Low Density Polyethylene has Much chain branching, where methyl groups replace hydrogens on the polymer chain, giving it a soft, mall eable properties as chains cannot pack tightly together. Polyvinylchloride has much chain stiffening due to the chlorine atoms attached to each of its monomers, giving it a more rigid, harder properties. Polystyrene Similarly has chain stiffening, but also lacks the chain branching of low density polyethylene, making its claims pack together densely to give a brittle polymer, and giving it transparent qualities, white
