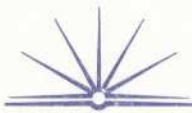


## Parenting and Caring

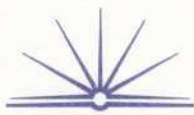

a) Children have the right to an education and a right to being treated appropriately and not subjected to abuse. These rights contribute to a child's well-being, as they each have benefits. From the age of 6, children have the right to an education which assists them in developing socially and intellectually. Education contributes to a child's well-being, as it enhances their social and intellectual stimulation and enables them to make friends & have more role models. Children's rights to being treated appropriately, and not being subjected to abuse, contribute to their well-being, as they do not experience abuse that will impact upon their state of mind and well-being. Abuse may lead to them experiencing low self-esteem, lack of necessary needs and they may lose their sense of identity. Both education and being treated



appropriately are important contributors to ~~children's~~<sup>the</sup> well-being of a child.

b) Nursing Mothers Association is a service I have studied that supports individuals in their role as parents and Carers. \* Culture and religion is a factor which will influence the relationships in this family situation. \* Past experience and the parent or carer's own background will influence the way they choose to raise the child. It will impact on



their views on life and perceptions of how a child should be raised. Their own experience will also influence the way they view adoption and their perception of the family.

\* The Gender of the parent or carer is another factor which will influence relationships. Each individual perceives their gender and gender expectations in a different way and will therefore allow their gender & gender expectations to influence their relationships in accordance with their views.

\* Socio-economic status is the financial status of an individual or family. To adopt a child a large amount of money is involved, and the parents must be financially stable. The Socio economic status of a family influences parenting and caring relationships in this family situation, as money and stability is the only way in which to adopt a child.

\* Health will impact upon relationships, parenting



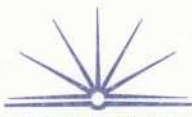
and caring. Adoptive parents are required to be healthy enough to raise a child.
