<i>Labour force data</i>	<i>Number of persons (million)</i>	Marks
Employed persons	9	
Unemployed persons	1	
Population of working age	16	
Total population	20	

- (a) Calculate the labour force unemployment rate for this nation.

$$\frac{1 \text{ million}}{17 \text{ million}} \times 100 = 6 \cdot 25\%$$

- (b) Calculate the labour force participation rate for this nation.

$$\frac{9 \text{ million}}{17 \text{ million}} \times 100 = 53\%$$

- (c) Explain ONE economic and ONE social cost created by unemployment.
