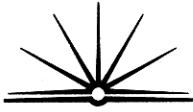


a) i) There is a change in the world around the composer. The change from the natural (paradise) to the unnatural (parking lot.)

ii) The repetition of the phrase "They paved paradise and put up a parking lot." is used to convey the feeling of change, and loss through this change. Paradise has been lost, and replaced by something mundane - a parking lot.

The composer also uses the phrase 'you don't know what you've got till it's gone.' to show the idea that something precious has been lost through the changes in the environment surrounding them.

b) The composer has tried to use humour to convey his attitudes towards change. The satirical use of "A Modern Tropical Rainforest." is examining larger billboards



which generally proclaim about new, large buildings or technological advancements. The composer is using humour to show that ~~the~~ changes have occurred so far that a tropical rainforest is like a technological advancement, so large and unknown.

c) Change in the natural world is a constant. The composer conveys the idea that change is a fact of life in the natural world. By using the cicada, which changes form throughout its life the idea of inevitable and unstoppable change is conveyed. 'Some signal, some brown vibration sets you to stir,' this line demonstrates that change has unknown motivation, it is just instinctive in the natural world.

d) The Inuit way of life has had both



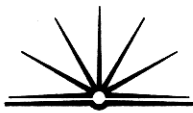

e) For the C-D rom 'Past, Present, ~~and~~ Future?

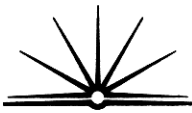
I would include the texts 1 and 2.
