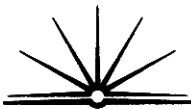

laid.

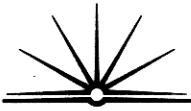
As devastated as I was, ~~a~~ I also

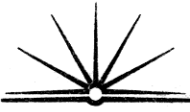
