



From these sources, name TWO locations within Christchurch that demonstrate different urban dynamics, and account for these differences.

Sources C and D show the North Western District with suburbs such as Burnside and Redwood for example. These areas demonstrate both suburbanisation and decentralization. They are different as they show the spread of suburbs away from the centre of the city, and the willingness of people to move into more distant regions in order to preserve a peaceful and more relaxing/salubrious lifestyle. In a similar fashion, source H, depicts the dynamic of counter-urbanisation. The location of residential areas and decentralization. This can be accounted for by people's desires to move away from metropolitan areas to preserve a different lifestyle. It is mainly influenced by changing social and cultural trends. The scenic location and the opportunity to expand further are also motivating factors. While the area is still in metropolitan Christchurch, the dynamic has allowed people to decentralize their location, but still remain in touch with the metropolitan area.
