- (c) Assess the impact that the health status of Australians has on the provision of health care facilities and services. 10

In Australia there are many different areas that need to be considered. These include:

- ★ Rural & Remote Areas
- ★ Socioeconomically disadvantaged people
- ★ Aboriginal & Torres Strait people
- ★ Older people
- ★ Men
- ★ Women

Health care in Australia is worked out on the basis of where the majority of the population lives. They have found that Rural & Remote areas need GPs who are up to date with Emergencies - for farm accidents. For older people there are Nursing homes that everyone is friendly. Lung cancer is considerably high for Socioeconomically disadvantaged people and Aboriginal and Torres Strait people. Many GPs in Australia are beginning to train in - acupuncture

- aromatherapy
