Being the most disadvantaged group in Australia, social class and prejudice views are found by the non-Aboriginal society.

This in turn ~~affects~~ affects the power and authority the Aboriginals have in our country. The lower social classes an individual has the less power and authority the individual has. A good example of this is the suffering of the Australian Aboriginals.

Today these racial views some non-Aboriginal people may have due to the portrayal of the Aboriginals in the media. The media over dramatises images of drunk Aboriginals

leading the Non-Aboriginal community to believe that All Aboriginals are Drunks. The white community believes this as we are vulnerable to the over dramatisation and gossip the media brings us.

The Idea that all Aboriginals are drunks is not true, compared with the rest of the community Aboriginals do not drink at all, however the small percentage that do tend to be high consumers of ~~illegal~~ Alcohol.

This is where ethnicity and prejudice affect the power and authority of the Aboriginals.

Today the prejudice people hold over Aboriginals is changing. Reconciliation being an important aspect of 2001 federation is an example of the changing attitudes people in power such as the government must put in place in order to change the nature of equality and difference in

our society.
