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At this point in time, Judaism is causing much conflict around the world, centred around the conflict in Israel.

Jews believe that Israel is Holy Land, and are in conflict to try and retain it. This surge has been pushed by the formation of the Zionist Movement, a group which wields no authority but holds a lot of power within the Jewish community. This conflict now involves major countries all around the world, with the UN providing assistance to stop the war.

Conflict also exists between orthodox jews and women within the feminist movement, who believe that the Orthodox Jewish faith is one based around a male-dominant environment. They argue that the segregation within the church environment, along with the both power and authority being held by all male rabbis, shows that the orthodox faith is a misogynistic one. Feminists also point out the tradition of the Sabbath and how its custom is one

based on women doing all the work.

Much conflict has also been seen throughout Judaism's past. Most ~~notably~~ <sup>recently</sup>, ~~is~~ seen through Hitler's attempt to eradicate all Jews, and stretching all the way back to Deuteronomy in the Torah, where the Jews were locked in much the same sort of struggle they are in today.

The faith is based around the 10 commandments, each of which is a charge to lead a peaceful and fulfilled life. This lifestyle has not changed ~~over~~ <sup>over</sup> time, even when ~~the~~ <sup>around it</sup> social & cultural environment has been exposed to ~~all~~ new ideas.
