

The understanding of peace is expressed in the bible (sacred texts of Christianity) and the Quran (sacred texts of Islam) as significant nature for all ~~the~~ adherents.

In both sacred texts adherents are taught to make peace between other humans.

Within the bible, ~~one~~ one of the ten commandments is to "love thy ~~but~~ neighbour" - which creates a social peace. ~~Followers~~ Followers were also told to make "peace on earth".

Within the Quran- adherents are referenced as "brothers" to each other - even if not biologically connected, and commanded to "love and make peace between your brothers".

In both religions God is referenced as a source of peace, and adherents are commanded to ~~make~~ make peace with God.

Within Christianity the bible ~~of~~ adherents are told by Jesus "Blessed are the peacemakers" - which means God blessing those who make peace among each other.

And in the Quran it is stated that God gave peace to his followers.

In both religions adherents are told to repent of their wrong doings and God will forgive them and bless them... which is seen as "making Peace with God."
