The Hindu pilgrimage involves a journey to sacred sites that is coupled with intense prayer and acts of devotion and charity. The pilgrim often carries little with them and travels either by foot or light transport. According to academic Diana Eck, "the pilgrim only brings with them faith". Pilgrimages are often journeyed to sacred sites - that can either be natural, or man-made, e.g. the temple of Sri Vindisran and the ancient city of Prayag, where the Kumbha Mela occurs. The Kumbha Mela, the largest

human gathering in history takes place once every 12 years and involves 70 million pilgrims. The focus of the mela is on the river Ganges, which is said to possess the liquid energy of Shiva's divine power. The mela is an example of pilgrimage that enables the pilgrim to strengthen their faith and often puts them out of their comfort zone. According to Wanda Eck, the satyagraha - or statement of intent for a pilgrimage and the physical act of visiting the sites are the two central features, however specific detail about pilgrimage is unknown.

The Hindu pilgrimage offers the individual the chance to experience sacrality of sites. Significant natural features - known as tords or tirthas are places where Eck believes, the physical and earthy realm cross over with the

spiritual dimension. The journeying to significant temples to worship deities also demonstrates pilgrimage's importance to Hinduism. It offers the pilgrim a chance to "see" or "darshan" their god - as Hindus believe the actual manifestation of a deity resides in their ~~image~~ image, then demonstrating the significance of Hinduism in providing unique experiences that enable pilgrims to enhance and enrich their faith.

It is an unofficial requirement to contribute to charity and the less fortunate as a means of gaining spiritual progression and a sense of personal and social fulfilment and responsibility.

They acquire the right to walk in the front of processions as indication of their advanced spiritual enlightenment. The pluralistic and divided nature of Hinduism ensure



that pilgrimage unites factions of Hinduism with a common goal of personal and spiritual enlightenment that helps to solidify the religion as a whole entity.
