

Both Christianity and Islam both respond to the issues among achieving inner and world peace. Christianity relies heavily on the New Testament as their sacred text and Islam rely on the Quran and Hadith. Both religions aim to achieve inner peace in order to gain world peace.

Christianity uses the New Testament as ~~the~~ their sacred text ~~to~~ in order to respond to peace. The New Testament conveys its view on peace as a gift left by Jesus shown by "peace is what I leave you with, my peace I give to you." ^{Psalms.} This provides adherents with the desires to live up to Jesus expectations ~~to~~ ~~of~~ of using little violence ~~and~~ ~~maintaining~~ and maintaining the land "he gave up for you" in a steady, peaceful environment. ~~This~~ This is effective in achieving peace as if peace is not obtained by an individual then they cannot walk humbly with God.

Like Christianity Islam uses the Quran and Hadith to promote peace as the only

way to live. They ~~as~~ as well focus on the importance on the land that was left to them is to remain peaceful and no violence is to be used.

The principal beliefs by Christians used to achieve inner peace is that Jesus is the giver of peace. This means that if a Christian is to follow the guidance of Jesus they will gain peace with Jesus.

A main belief by Christians was created in response to arguing issues about violence.

The 'Just War Theory' was established by Augustine in the fourth century and has been effective in reducing violence. It involves the use of no violence of war until all other peaceful alternatives have been utilised. This links with the quote of all "Populations caught up in war naturally want it to stop" as with the Just War Theory violence is not used, unless necessary.

Similarly, Muslims are not able to use violence in order to achieve things and ~~will~~ ~~will~~ will be not following their

Muslim faith if it done. This links with the quote of how individuals without war want to live in peace in order to achieve a better future.

To achieve world peace, inner peace is needed to be achieved. A number of Christian organisations promote world peace with a large example of National Council of Churches Australia (NCCA) where all Christians come together and discuss differences within their churches, therefore reducing the issues of world peace. For Christ is a large belief ^{organisation} that ~~is~~ simply means peace of Christ. Again the influence of Jesus leaving peace as his parting gift is very influential on Christian adherents. Islamic adherents also need to achieve ~~world~~ inner ~~peace~~ to achieve world peace with the Torah ^{way} ~~being~~ a main source in creating inner peace.
