In this particular extract Cicero used all types of rhetoric techniques ranging from rhetorical questions to exaggeration.

Cicero has used rhetorical questions throughout the passage

"... videtur?" and "Nonne ... imperabis?" The rhetorical questions

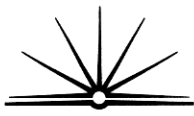
add to the effect of ~~the~~ keeping the audience in suspense.

He combines the questions and piles them one after another, which show the fast paced nature of his accusatory tones and Catiline's inability to answer his questions.

Cicero's who passage is very argumentative and accusatory. He used many word like "quem", "quid", "quae" which add to their effects with the sharp sound of "q". "Who?", "What", "Why"

Cicero also uses repetition throughout his passage to emphasize the repetition of "quem"

Cicero tends to exaggerate throughout his passage, this adds to his rhetorical ~~the keeps the audience in suspense~~ effect as he uses it as comparisons.



He has used an anaphora of "m" "quem esse ~~esse~~ hostem
compemisti" which has been used to give a
sense of foreboding tone.

Cicero has used alliteration. "publica
perniciosos" as a type of word associates
to drill into the people that the state
is in danger.

Cicero has used various rhetorical techniques to
reaveal cataline's plans to the people.
